Exhibition of Creative Work

Field Sights Exhibit Space

In 2019, Zanotti co-founded Field Sights, a rotating exhibit space in the Department of Anthropology at Purdue University, featuring photo, print, sketches, drawings, smudges, and other two-dimensional art forms. Located on the third floor in Stone Hall, Field Sites curators design visual stories to explore human cultural diversity through time and globally and teach us human and other primate adaptations on our planet. As we are also committed to figuring out how to make things better for human societies—how to solve the grand challenges while respecting differences, to live as neighbors on one small planet, and helping one another to achieve fulfillment, peace, justice, and freedom - we apply anthropological knowledge and perspectives to work in diverse two dimensional mediums to share with you stories and insights.

Mediums - Anthropology Exhibit Space

Mediums, an annual permanent exhibit space at Purdue University, was inaugurated in 2019. The mediums exhibit space, located on the second floor in Stone Hall, brings together material objects, two-dimensional art, and other mediums to tell anthropologically informed stories about global challenges. Zanotti was the founder of the exhibit space and worked with collaborators Cooper and McMullen to open the space with the Electronic Life Histories Exhibit.
